The trail in dance on Thursday night was just a taste of what was to come - fast, fun dancing, very social crowd, and energized callers. It was amazing to be in a dance hall with some many dancers all having a great time and enjoying each others company.

As the weekend progressed I danced at the A2 level for most of the weekend, and I was very proud that I was able to keep up and not mess up too often. I had heard stories that the dancing at convention was more challenging, and while it was faster and a bit more intense, it wasn't impossible. In fact it was a much more satisfying pace of dancing.

I also participated in a few of the specialty tips, dances at the mainstream level that brought together a certain group of people - the bear tip, leather tip, and the moonshine tip! I missed the Canadian tip because someone scheduled it for 9 am, way too early for me to be dancing.

I loved that there was always something going on, you could dance as much as you wanted, and you could take a break to socialize whenever you wanted. Oh! And then there was the fun badge tour, fab!

# Fly-In (written by Don Cheff and Terri Rothman)

<u>Don Cheff</u> would like to receive more pictures from our Fly-In, for the archives, please! **Fly-In summary**: This year, we had 87 Fly-In participants (including 3 non-dancers). Besides our own club members, there were 10 from elsewhere in Canada, 17 from the U.S., and 1 from Germany. The event made a small profit, in spite of incurring unexpected expenses (hiring Don St. Jean as a substitute caller for Friday night, and Dayle Hodge's additional travel expenses). Eight dancers took advantage of the first-timer 50% off rate. Thirty dancers registered in advance for the 2014 Fly-In, fifteen of whom paid by credit card. **2014 Fly-In**: Committee will consist of Paul Kivisto, Steve McKeown, and Don Cheff; the event will be called "Scoot Back to the 60s". Cost for regular dancers: \$85.00 until March 1, 2014 (\$100 after that); mainstream dancers: \$75.00 anytime.

Thank you to the 23 people who completed the after-Fly-In survey. The Fly-In Committee will take all your suggestions into consideration for next year. In the meantime, here are responses to a few concerns:

- Have you considered "workshops" for dancers during the Saturday morning slot, ie, 10noon?
  - Saturday morning is when we set up tables and chairs, as well as most of the decorations. Guest callers are paid for just Friday night, Saturday afternoon and

- evening, plus Sunday afternoon. Club callers are recruited to give guest callers a break on Saturday.
- Please bring back the brunch at a local restaurant and have the potluck on Friday evening or Saturday.

Many club members were not able to leave work early enough on Friday to go home then get to the venue with heated food. They found it too much of a rush. If we moved the potluck to Saturday, many club members who live far from downtown wouldnâ €™t be able to go home to prepare and heat their contribution. Unfortunately, we don't have facilities to heat up food at Jesse Ketchum. In terms of having the brunch at a restaurant: Most



restaurants in downtown Toronto are expensive, even for a buffet brunch, and don't have free parking. We would have to increase the weekend fee for the Fly-In if we coordinated the brunch at a restaurant or hotel, and there's no guarantee that the room would be conducive to socializing as is currently enjoyed in the JK cafeteria.

It would be nice to maybe have an open dedicated Facebook page or message board so that out-of-towners could coordinate better w/local club members.
For the past two years, the Fly-In has had a <u>Wordpress site</u>, to which visitors could post queries, but not all club members view the site on a regular basis. The most direct method is to post to the <u>▲ Facebook page</u> or write to <u>satb@trianglesquares.com</u> for assistance.
